FORERLINNERS OF THE AMERICAN COMIC BOOK: PHLP FICTION

SOMETHING NEW THAT WAS HAPPENING IN AMERICA. THERE WERE CHARACTERS, FOR EXAMPLE, COMING OUT OF THE PULP MAGAZINES, LIKE THE SHADOW.



PHLP FICTION?

THESE MAGAZINES WERE CALLED PULP FICTION BECAUSE OF THE PAPER THEY WERE PRINTED ON. THEY WERE UNFINISHED PIECES OF PAPER AND THEY HAD ROUGH EDGES, AND THEY WERE CHEAP **MEANING THAT EVEN THE POOREST OF PEOPLE FELT LIKE THEY COULD** AFFORD THEM.





THEN THE SHADOW WAS ALSO A COMIC BOOK (AND LATER NOVELS) AND A RADIO SHOW, AND HE WAS IN MOVIES, TOO. THIS HAD NEVER HAPPENED BEFORE, WHERE YOU COULD WATCH A CHARACTER, YOU COULD READ ABOUT THEM, AND YOU COULD HEAR STORIES ABOUT THEM ON THE RADIO!


DOES THIS SOUND LIKE TODAY?

POLICE AS VILLAINS?

- AMERICANS SEEMED TO FEEL AT THE TIME THAT THE POLICE WEREN'T AS EFFECTIVE AS THEY SHOULD BE, THAT MAYBE SOME OF THEM WERE CORRUPT.
- AND SO MOB BOSSES, HIT MEN AND CORRUPT POLICE OFFICERS BECAME THE MAIN VILLAINS IN STORIES.

- LISTEN TO CLIPS FROM AN EPISODE OF THE SHADOW FROM TIMES PAST OLD TIME RADIO.








